Comment	The Northumberland and Newcastle Society (N&N) submits the following comments in respect of this scheme. The Society recognises the need to provide charging points for electric vehicles close to major road networks as part of an environmentally sustainable transport system. The site in question has had previous applications for light industrial units quite rightly refused as affecting nearby homeowners, therefore any non-residential proposal is always going to be a contentious issue. The access to the proposed development is from the A191 dual carriageway which is often extremely congested leading to the Holystone (A19) roundabout, especially during school times. The recent massive housebuilding schemes along this major transport corridor heading into Newcastle combined with the new developments about to start on Killingworth Moor will no doubt put even more pressure on this already overloaded junction with the A19. The suggested egress from the site is via a one-way system could possibly be circumvented and we believe will be detrimental to residents who already accommodate patrons to the hotel and public house. We also question the need for further retail within the scheme when there is already provision nearby. We would suggest a more appropriate location would be to east of the A19 on an existing retail park which is currently still being developed and to leave the proposed site as a designated open space for residents to enjoy.
